THE SCHOOL

DAIS is an English medium, K-12 co-educational, private, non-profit day school founded in 2003, providing a learning environment that encourages children to bring out their best and which supports their all-round development, through discovering the joy of learning, awakening and illuminating their intellect in multi-dimensional ways, and instilling abiding values. The DAIS motto is 'Dare to Dream, Learn to Excel'.

CURRICULUM

- Lower KG to Grade 7: an integrated curriculum of national and international examination boards.
- Grades 8 to 10, students choose either the Indian Certificate of Secondary Education programme (ICSE) or the University of Cambridge's International General Certificate of Secondary Education (IGCSE) programme.
- Grades 11 and 12 pursue the International Baccalaureate Diploma (IBD) Programme.

ADMISSION

Admission to DAIS is selective and is completed through a process of application, testing and interactions.

ACADEMIC CALENDAR

DAIS operates on a semester calendar, with Semester 1 from mid-July to mid-December and Semester 2 from early January to early June. The Class of 2017 is expected to graduate on May 27, 2017.

HIGH SCHOOL COURSE LOAD

Grades 9 & 10: ICSE (8 courses of two years duration) and IGCSE: (Minimum of 8 and maximum of 10 courses).

Grade 11 & 12: All students enrol in the IB Diploma Programme, completing six 2-year long courses (3 x HL and 3 x SL), TOK, Extended Essay and CAS.

STUDENT OPPORTUNITIES

Students actively engage in sporting and co-curricular activities, while integrating service to community as part of their education at DAIS and opportunities include: MUN, Round Square, the International Award for Young People (IAYP), the DAIS Study and Activity Centre, Annual Day Event and Fete, exchange programmes (L'Ermitage School in Paris, France, SEK Ciudalcampo International School in Madrid, Spain, Open Gate School in Prague, Czech Republic, Bavarian International School in Bavaria, Germany and Liceo Scientifico Farnesina School in Rome, Italy), community service activities and support in villages, slums, disadvantaged schools and local NGOs, DAIS Leadership Series (DLS), TEDxYouth@DAIS and sports (football, basketball, cricket, judo, soccer, taekwondo, swimming, squash, tennis, table tennis, and badminton).

GRADING

In Grades 9 and 10, IGCSE = A^* to U (with A^* the highest), and ICSE = % marks. In Grades 11 and 12 the IB awards Grades of 7 to 1 (with 7 being the highest).

RANKING AND CGPA CALCULATION

DAIS does not rank its students however, all students receive a Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) based upon the work completed in Grade 9 through to Grade 12 according to a 4-point GPA conversion table as outlined in the transcript. Final HS Transcripts will be sent to colleges in April however IB DP results are NOT included in the CGPA calculation and the official statement of IB results will be sent to attending universities in early July.





UNIVERSITY APPLICATION LIMITS

At DAIS we believe that students and universities alike are better served, when students make informed choices early in the application process. We therefore limit our Seniors to a maximum of 12 colleges worldwide. Because of this limit, colleges and universities can know that an application from a DAIS student reflects genuine interest.
