### **Indo-French Exchange program:**

Young people from the three nations - India, Pakistan and Bangladesh, came together in an attempt to bring our countries and their youth closer to each other by celebrating these bonds, and concentrating on our similarities rather than our differences. The conference involves discussions that focus on our past, or on recent events, and present unconventional activities that involve getting to know one another, or doing away with stereotypes. Indians, Pakistanis and Bangladeshis actually live together for that one week, strengthen these bonds, and help the youth of our countries understand one another for what we truly are, rather than as a faceless 'enemy'. Paigaam 2010 - brought together students from different parts of India like - The Assam Valley School, The International School of Bangalore, Dhirubhai Ambani International School, Mumbai, and from our neighbouring countries like, Mastermind School, Dhaka and Karachi Grammar School, Karachi.

Nishanth Nagavar and Yogesh Dhingra had seven eventful and exhaustive weeks trained on a program TEA (Teaching Excellence and Achievement Program) planned by an educational NGO, IREX (International Research and Exchange Board) in collaboration with the US govt. IREX further tied up with College of Education and Research Centre of Art and Sciences at University of South Florida for further conduct of the program. The program, started with 3 days opening conference at Washington on 1st February 2010 and concluding conference at University of Lincoln at Nebraska on 18th March 2010.  During the 6 weeks Nishant and Yogesh spent at University of South Florida, they were fully engaged in all seminars enriching their teaching content and skills, and interacting with highly effective and caring educators from all over the world. They participated in seminars on topics such as – 'Teacher expectations and creating a positive classroom', 'Active learning styles and strategies'.
