Role Summary:

The Specialist Teacher is accountable to the Head of Learning and Subject Head (where applicable) and reports to Head of Early Learning/Head of Centre.

Key Responsibilities:

Learning Design:

- Plan and deliver subject-specific lessons that align with the learning philosophy and curriculum objectives.
- Collaborate with the Head of Learning and Home Room Teachers (HRTs) on any areas of integration with the learning themes.
- Design hands-on and experiential activities that cater to diverse learning needs and promote curiosity, creativity, and exploration.

Co-Teaching:

- Collaborate with other Specialist Teachers to co-teach sessions effectively
- Support co-teachers by providing expertise in the specialised subject and ensuring a seamless connection with classroom activities.
- Actively participate in planning meetings to align subject goals with broader classroom objectives.

Assessment:

- Assess learners' progress using developmentally appropriate tools and methods aligned with the school's policies.
- Provide timely and constructive feedback to relevant members of the learning community to support learners.
- Maintain records of learner development and share insights with HRTs and parents during conferences and through reports.

- Create a safe, inclusive, and stimulating environment tailored to the specialised subject.
- Set up and maintain subject-specific resources and materials that encourage exploration and skill development.
- Manage routines and transitions to ensure smooth operations during sessions.
