The co-ed K-12 DAIS has been ranked India's #1 international day school for ten consecutive years (2013-2022) in the annual EducationWorld India School Rankings and is routinely top ranked on several parameters of education excellence including academic reputation, individual attention to

students, leadership, and competence of teachers. Moreover, in 2019, the UK-based Education Adviser Ltd ranked DAIS among the Top 10 IB schools worldwide.

We are an accredited International Baccalaureate DP school, a PYP candidate school, and in the process of becoming a MYP candidate school. In addition, we are affiliated with the Delhi-based Council for the Indian School Certificate Examinations (CISCE) and UK-based Cambridge Assessment International Education (CAIE). Throughout our journey, we have acquired an excellent reputation for providing rigorous academic, co-curricular and sports education to our 1,098 students mentored by 183 carefully selected teachers from 14 countries across the world.

LIVING IN MUMBAI



Often referred to as the "Gateway of India," Mumbai is characterized by colour, energy and life. A lively place, where people from various cultures, religions and economic backgrounds carve a path for themselves to create "the city of dreams." Both gritty and glamorous, Mumbai embodies the personality of current day India.

From the hip and trendy cocktail bars to hawker stalls stocked with patties, puris, kebabs and lassis, there is something for everyone. Living in Mumbai is an experience that will stay with you forever. Living here offers great potential for savings. One can have a comfortable lifestyle at USD 1,200 per month, if single and roughly USD 1,500 per month, if living with a partner.

Mumbai is a coastal city with moderate temperatures through the year. The spring and summer months can get hot with temperatures reaching 104°F (40°C) on occasional days. The winter months are considerably more comfortable with average daytime temperatures reaching 74°F (23°C) to 86°F (30°C). July to September are months that see a lot of rain bringing the temperatures down.

FACULTY RESIDENCE IN MUMBAI

Swadeshi is a 6-tower residential complex is in Chunabhatti, Sion. Facilities include a swimming pool, gym with a sauna and jacuzzi, gardens, a play area for children, a walking track, squash, tennis and badminton courts. There is a community hall that can be booked for special occasions. It is a gated complex with 24-hour security. Right outside the gates are convenience stores, and a full grocery store. We are pet friendly! Large and spacious two-bedroom apartments include ensuite bathrooms, a large lounge/dining room with balcony, kitchen, laundry room and a spare washroom. These furnished apartments include AC units in each room, and white goods (fridge, washer, dryer, microwave etc). The onsite maintenance staff are friendly, helpful, and readily available. You can hire cleaning staff and childcare independently; parking is also available for residents with private vehicles.

A minibus for expatriates leaves for school at 7.30 every morning (roughly a twenty-minute journey) and departs from school at 4.15 (roughly a half hour journey due to traffic).
